



Ticknall Map Reading Ride Sunday 16 July 2017

Venue: Woodside Farm, Stanton Hill, Ticknall. Derby. DE73 7LA

Venue: The farmer lives on site so please be courteous. The venue is a spacious field. Please note there is no hard standing. You may set up a corrall for your horse whilst the theory session is in progress

You can arrive at the venue from 9.30am, ready to commence the theory at 10am.

THE VENUE IS AN COMPULSORY WALK ZONE & Dogs must be kept on a lead at all times

Bring a chair for the theory session. There will be no catering so please bring any refreshments that you might need.

Toilets are available and water in self filling troughs

There will be no Sport Endurance bibs issued – please ensure that you bring your own hi-viz for safety reasons.

Maps will be issued on the day. Although no time limits, there is still the expectation that you will complete the course no slower than 6mph.

You will be allowed out on course in no more than groups of two – this way one person doesn't do all the work!!!

There will be one gate that is manned, please leave all others as you find them as some fields do have livestock in them. The route is approximately 10 miles long on both public and permissive bridleways with only two small stretches of roadwork (both quiet lanes). There are four road crossings which will not be manned however visibility is good.

No SPURS or whips longer than 30" as per our rules. All riders should take time to read through our rules – these can be found on our website.

Standing Martingales are also not permitted without written approval prior to the ride Hats must be properly secured by a chin strap and be up to the current safety standard. All riders should take time to read through our rules – these can be found on our website.

First Aider

This event does not have an official first aider but there are plenty helpers who are qualified in first aid, a first aid kit will be at the secretary tent.

Never pass another horse without asking permission first, always pass at a pace no more than trot. Remember that not everyone may be a confident rider or they may have a novice horse, please see below tail ribbons for guidance.

TAIL RIBBONS

Please wear the follow ribbons in your horse's tail if needed.

RED RIBBON – My horse may kick

GREEN RIBBON – I or my horse are nervous /novice, approach with caution and pass with care

BLUE RIBBON – My horse is a stallion

All droppings must be picked up off the venue and taken home with you Regards
