



Hoveringham Ride

Sunday 7th June 2014

VENUE: Boat Lane, Hoveringham, Nottingham NG14 7JP

DIRECTIONS:

Situated off the A612, Nottingham to Southwell road between Lowdham and Thurgarton. The post code for sat nav is NG14 7JP. Down the road from Ferry Farm – Follow the brown signs



Venue Arrival:

Riders can arrive at the venue from 9.30am. First Horse out on course 9.45am last Horse away 11.45am.

The venue is field parking and is lightly to be full due to entries, No hard standing available. All vehicles will be shown a space by a steward to maximise space

Please ensure you print off a map and know your bib number. At the end of the ride members can record their official mileage on the list provided at the secretary.

Route

The ride is 8 miles which you are welcome to ride it twice time permitting. The route will be marked with spray painted arrows although we have issued a map. Ride terrain is quiet country lanes, nature trail and long canter stretches along the river Trent (No Galloping). The route does go through farmers fields and some will have **COWS PRESENT**, there is also a

small wooden bridge to walk over which is horse friendly, there are gates on route but these will be manned wherever possible depending on helpers. On the canter stretch back along the river Trent is very popular with walkers, PLEASE be courteous and do not canter past them.

Facilities

The venue has NO water, toilets or catering, however Ferry Farm is short walk away which does have toilets and Cafe, there is water troughs on route if required.

First Aider:

This event does not have an official first aider, however there is a first aid kit located at the secretary.

Notes:

Please clear droppings away and take home. Do not leave on venue.

Never pass another horse without asking permission first, always pass at a pace no more than trot. Remember that not everyone may be a confident rider or they may have a novice horse, please see below tail ribbons for guidance.

TAIL RIBBONS

Please wear the follow ribbons in your horse's tail if needed.

RED RIBBON – My horse may kick

GREEN RIBBON – I or my horse are nervous /novice, approach with caution and pass with care

BLUE RIBBON - My horse is a stallion
