Venue: Boothay Farm, Leapley Lane, Ashbourne, DE6 2DU What3words : probe.eggshell.school

Venue: Please do not arrive before 09:00 am as the venue will not be ready.

Pleasure Riders.

First horse away 9.30am Last horse 11:00. If you're riding the longer mileage please be on course by 10:00am and all horses must be back by 13:30pm.

Once you have parked up and unloaded your horses please come to the check-in at the secretary's tent, where you can collect your bib & emergency wrist bands. Don't forget to return your bib after the ride and record your mileage on the website when you get home.

Pleasure ride distances: 6 & 12 Miles. 12 miles is 2 laps of the Farm ride. There may not be a map for this ride, but it is very well marked with wooden posts and arrows

First Aider: This event does not have an official first aider, a first aid kit will be at the secretary tent

Catering: All catering done by the venue owner.

Toilets; Please be aware that there are <u>no toilets</u> available.

Please collect droppings into the bushes and take litter home, leave area clean and tidy so we can return.

Route: Picturesque route across private farm land, with approx. 0.5 miles of quiet roadwork through the pretty village of Yeaveley. Keep an eye out for the giraffe!

There are some jumps on the route which MUST NOT BE USED.

THE VENUE IS A COMPULSORY WALK ZONE.

DOGS MUST BE KEPT ON A LEAD AT ALL TIMES

No SPURS or Whips longer than 30" as per our rules. Standing Martingale are also not permitted without written approval prior to the ride

Hats must be secured by chin strap and meet current standard

Head Cameras may be used but are not recommended as may alter the safety of the hat (they are safer on arm, leg or body)

All riders should take time to read through our rules – these can be found on our website.

Never pass another horse without asking permission first, always pass at a pace no more than trot. Remember that not everyone may be a confident rider or they may have a novice horse, please see below tail ribbons for guidance.

TAIL RIBBONS

Please wear the follow ribbons in your horse's tail if needed.

RED RIBBON – My horse may kick

GREEN RIBBON – I or my horse are nervous /novice, approach with caution and pass with care

BLUE RIBBON – My horse is a stallion
